Dear Spartan Families:

Last evening the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services modified the existing (April 19) order that regulates the use of facial coverings at outdoor gatherings. Two of these modifications have immediate implications for our students at ICS, and I want to share them with you here. Per the new MDHHS order, the following changes regarding the use of facial coverings go into effect tomorrow, Thursday, May 6, 2021:

- The use of a facial covering during an outdoor activity of less than 100 people is now considered optional. This would include elementary recess periods and outdoor physical education classes. This would also include any other classes conducted outdoors.
- The use of a facial coverings for spectators attending outdoor events, such as baseball games, softball games, soccer games, tennis matches and smaller track meets is also optional. At crowded events (over 100 spectators) the use of facial coverings is still required.

It is important to note that these modifications *provide options* for families. We encourage any students, families, or individuals who prefer to wear facial coverings during outdoor events to continue do so.
